## Information and Instructions

### Grounds for making an appeal

The selection to programmes/courses in Sweden is made on the basis of set entry requirements for each programme/course and the verified qualifications submitted by the applicant. You may appeal decisions made regarding whether you meet the general and specific entry requirements for a specific course or programme.

### Using the appeals form

We've provided this appeals form to help you write your appeal. It is not required. Enter your data on the screen, print the form, sign it, and upload it using your account at [Universityadmissions.se](http://Universityadmissions.se). If you are unable to upload your document, you can send your form to the address indicated on the first page.

If you wish to make an appeal for more than one programme/course, we recommend you submit a separate form for each.

### Refer to requirements

In your appeal, you must state which university the appeal concerns, the decision you are appealing, and the reason for the ap-

peal. It is important that you refer to the entry requirements for the programme/course.

### Time limit

The appeals form must reach University Admissions in Sweden no later than three weeks from the date you read your admissions results.

### Response to the appeal

First, the university will review your appeal to see if there are grounds to reverse their decision. The university will then forward your appeal to the Higher Education Appeals Board. The decision that the Appeals Board makes is final and cannot be appealed.
